








## OUR MISSION

2017 was an exciting year for bikeshare in the United States. By the end of the year, there were a reported 109 public-use bikeshare systems in the US and that trend shows no sign of slowing. From smart bikes to dockless bikes, technology and innovation played a huge role in the changing landscape of bikesharing. In Fort Worth, we began to contemplate how these changes will impact our system and what strategic steps we should take to ensure that our program remains an integral part of the transportation network for years to come.

The rising demand for bikesharing on both a global and local level is inspiring. More individuals are looking for ways out of their single-occupancy vehicles and into alternative modes of transportation. 

























AVERAGE MAINTENANCE HOURS PER WEEK

-Round trip route to Trinity Park South -Average Trip Duration 47 minutes -Average Trip Distance 6.6 miles













TOTAL MILES SINCE FWBS LAUNCHED IN APRIL 2013

#### **FIRST MILE**

In 2017, Fort Worth Bike Sharing continued its work with local, non-profit organizations to identify candidates for First Mile, its low-income membership program. While FWBS celebrates each new member, there is still work to be done to serve community members of every income level and background.

In 2018, FWBS will modify its website in an effort to create an equitable sign-up experience and streamlined access for more individuals. When the new site is online, anyone with a state-issued EBT card will be able to use their card number to automatically qualify for a reduced-price membership. Through various fundraising activities, including the always entertaining Lip Sync Battle (photos below), FWBS will raise funds for the website improvements.







The bikeshare industry has grown exponentially since its introduction in the United States about 10 years ago, but 2017 saw an unexpected surge when tech startups expanded operations from China to the United States. Long-term implications of these dockless systems are the topic of much discussion world-wide, as the business model is unproven. In the short-term, however, dockless bike sharing has pushed cycling as a means of transportation to the forefront of discussion in some of the largest cities in the country.

Fort Worth Bike Sharing will utilize that discussion to focus stakeholder efforts toward researching and implementing equipment options that will best meet the needs of our city. Among other options, FWBS is investigating electric-assist BCycles which provide a faster, less strenuous option for getting people where they need to go, but with the same minimal impact on our environment and efficient use of public space. FWBS will spend the next year working to identify funding that will enable the incorporation of new technologies into its existing system.
